Conflict in the Workplace: Resolving the Nurse-Physician Clash

Data were collected with the Sociodemographic Characteristics Questionnaire and the Rahim Organizational Conflict Inventory. Results: Of the conflict-management styles, the one preferred by the participating nurse managers was collaborating, followed by compromising, avoiding, competing, and accommodating. However, age, educational background, length of service, and managerial experience were effective in determining the style of conflict resolution.

Conflict among nurses has a negative impact on the retention of qualified staff and patient outcomes, and the shortage of nurses due to job dissatisfaction as a result of work place conflict creating a stressful and unpleasant environment (Almost, Doran, Hall, & Laschinger, 2010).

Nurses may call upon a 'forcing' conflict resolution style in the case of a patient being verbally or physically abusive to a staff member. The nurse would come into the situation with a strong and forceful authority to stop the behavior and end the conflict, then move to another style to address the actual incident.
