The use of evidence-based practice (EBP) has become the

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standard of health care practice. Nurses are expected to use best evidence on a wide range of topics, yet most nurses have limited time, resources, and/or skills to access and evaluate the quality of research and evidence needed to practice evidence-based nursing.

Evidence-based practice guidelines and school nursing

The purpose of this nurse retention evidence-based practice guideline is to provide strategies for first line nurse managers in various health care settings to use in enhancing job satisfaction and decreasing turnover of staff nurses. Interventions are focused on three areas that are beyond compensation issues and are within the purview of nurse managers: (a) autonomy; (b) recognition; and (c) communication.

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Meta-analysis is a study design that uses statistical techniques to combine and analyze data from many RCTs. Evidence-based clinical practice guidelines provide the strongest level of evidence to guide clinical practice because they are based on rigorous reviews of the best evidence on specific topics.
