The "M.33" moniker goes back to its production in WWI - where smaller ships weren't deemed worthy of getting a name (like Enterprise, Victory, Endeavour, Supreme Bleeding Product of Royal Incest of York, and the like) - instead, those "inferior vessels" were just referred to by a character and a number.
