When planning instructional strategies, teachers need to

- Keep learning goals in mind
- Consider assessment strategies
- Determine what would constitute evidence that students have reached the learning goals

All of this needs to be considered within the context of instruction, rather than as an isolated step in the instruction cycle.

Assessment DEFINING MODERATION FOR AND OF ASSESSMENT ...

Teachers may elect to have students self-correct. The teacher collects assessment results to monitor individual student progress and to inform future instruction. Both student and teacher can quickly assess whether the student acquired the intended knowledge and skills. This is a formative assessment, so a grade is not the intended purpose.
